5.1 LONG TERM PLAN 2024-2034 (TASMAN'S TEN YEAR PLAN) SUBMISSIONS HEARINGS

1. Purpose of the Report / Te Take mō te Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to accept the submissions on the proposed Long Term Plan 2024-2034 (Tasman's Ten Year Plan) and concurrent consultations, including late submissions received on 29 and 30 April 2024.
- 1.2 This report also sets out the schedule for speakers at the Hearings. Any changes to the submitter schedule will be advised at the beginning of each day.
- 1.3 This report does not contain the staff deliberations report. This will be provided to the Council prior to the deliberations, which are scheduled for 23, 24, 29, and 30 May 2024.

2. Summary / Te Tuhinga Whakarāpotō

- 2.1 Consultation on Tasman's Ten Year Plan and concurrent consultation has now closed. Council received 1,048 submissions within the submission period of 28 March 2024 to 28 April 2024. This report seeks that the Council accepts the 1,060 submissions received up until 30 April 2024, including 12 late submissions, and that the submissions received after 30 April 2024 are not accepted.
- 2.2 All submissions received on Tasman's Ten Year Plan and concurrent consultations are available on Shape Tasman, [Tasman's 10-Year Plan | Shape Tasman](#).
- 2.3 This report sets out the submitter hearing schedule for the three days, 8 to 10 May 2024, in Richmond, Tākaka, Motueka and via Zoom. Subsequent changes to the submitter order will be advised before the beginning of each hearing day.
- 2.4 An analysis of the submissions received will be presented to the Council prior to deliberations which are scheduled for 23, 24, 29 and 30 May 2024.

3. Recommendation/s / Ngā Tūtohunga

4. Background / Horopaki

- 4.1 The Hearing Panel will consist of the Mayor and Councillors and the Hearing Panel Chair is Mayor King and the Deputy Chair is Deputy Mayor Bryant.
- 4.2 Hearings are to be held:
 - Wednesday 8 May 2024 commencing at 9.30 am in Richmond at the Council Chambers;
 - Thursday 9 May 2024 commencing at 10.30 am in Tākaka at the Tākaka Service Centre;
 - Friday 10 May 2024 commencing at 9.30 am in Motueka at the Motueka Library.
- 4.3 Deliberations are to be held in Richmond at the Council Chambers on:
 - Thursday 23 May 2024 commencing at 9.30 am;
 - Friday 24 May 2024 commencing at 9.30 am;
 - Wednesday 29 May 2024 commencing at 9.30 am; and
 - Thursday 30 May 2024 commencing at 9.30 am.
- 4.4 All submissions received on Tasman’s Ten Year Plan and concurrent consultations are available on Shape Tasman, [Tasman's 10-Year Plan | Shape Tasman](#).

- 4.5 One hundred and fifty (150) submitters have indicated they wish to speak to their submission. Speakers with an email address were contacted on 30 April 2024 with their schedule speaking time, and two speakers were contacted by phone on 1 May 2024. As at 1 May 2024, not all speakers have yet confirmed attendance at the hearing. Subsequent changes to the submitter speaking order will be advised before the beginning of each hearing day.
- 4.6 Each submitter has been allowed a maximum of five minutes to speak to their submission. This time includes any points of clarification from the Hearing Panel. If the submitter uses their full five minutes, there is no additional time for questions due to the number of submitters wishing to be heard.
- 4.7 Staff have asked submitters to be available from the start of the half-hour that they have been assigned to, and staff have allocated up to seven submitters per half-hour. This is in the knowledge that some will not use their allocated five minutes and that there may be some submitters who do not attend.
- 4.8 There were five submissions that contained unacceptable and defamatory comments. Those submissions have been accepted but with the unacceptable comments redacted.
- 4.9 There were two submissions received without their name provided. These submissions have not been accepted.
- 4.10 The Hearings Panel chair will seek direction from the Hearings Panel on any additional matters raised during the Hearings, which require staff advice in the staff deliberations report.

5. Submitters to be heard

- 5.1 The Hearings Schedule, as at 1 May 2024, is attached to this report (**Attachment 1**).

6. Options / Kōwhiringa

- 6.1 The Council has asked the community for its views so it is recommended that the Council accept the submissions on the proposed Ten Year Plan 2024-2034 and concurrent consultations, including late submissions received on 29 and 30 April 2024.

7. Legal / Ngā ture

- 7.1 As required under sections 82 and 83 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA), the Council is required to provide the opportunity for submitters to present their submissions.
- 7.2 The LGA recognises the importance of the Ten Year Plan Consultation Document and therefore, requires that the Special Consultative Procedure, as set out in section 83, must be used prior to adopting the final Ten Year Plan.
- 7.3 In addition, the Schedule of Fees and Charges for 2024/2025 is being consulted on using the Special Consultative Procedure.
- 7.4 Providing the opportunity for submitters to present their submissions to the Council is a requirement of the Special Consultative Procedure.
- 7.5 The various policies being consulted on concurrently with the Ten Year Plan consultation document, need to meet the requirements of section 82, as well as the Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. The Council has broad discretion about how to carry

out consultation under section 82. On this occasion, this includes providing the opportunity to present submissions to the Council.

8. Iwi Engagement / Whakawhitiwhiti ā-Hapori Māori

- 8.1 Initial discussions on engaging iwi in the Long Term Plan (LTP) process took place with iwi General Managers and Chief Executives in October 2022. Since then, we have made several invitations to all nine iwi Trusts to engage on the LTP. This took the form of several offers for the Trusts to provide advice on how they wanted to be engaged.
- 8.2 Manawhenua ki Mohua hosted and participated in one of the early engagement hui in May 2023. Representatives of Te Āwhina Marae attended and participated in the Motueka early engagement workshop.
- 8.3 Staff analysed the iwi environmental plans and iwi Trust's strategic plans to identify the areas of priority that had a relationship to the LTP. We identified the connection to the LTP and asked some open questions to stimulate iwi thinking about the LTP. We circulated this information to the iwi Trusts to try to improve understanding about how the LTP impacted areas of interest to iwi.
- 8.4 We held two online hui with Taiao staff and general managers from several iwi Trusts, where the LTP was explained, key linkages to areas of iwi interest were identified and discussion took place. Some iwi discussed specific matters as part of this hui. The opportunity to engage further with the Council was offered with the (then) Kaihautū offering herself and Te Kāhui Hononga as guides to connect iwi to the right people within the Council and processes to engage on matters of interest.
- 8.5 Subsequently, staff have carried out some engagement on Te Ture Whenua Māori Act, aspects of the Development and Financial Contributions Policy, and the Remission and Postponement of Rates on Māori Land Policy. Some initial feedback was received from the iwi Trusts on these matters.
- 8.6 The Kaihautū sent a further memo to iwi general managers outlining the timeline for consultation and submissions and raising the following items with them from the LTP documentation:
 - 8.6.1 Te Ture Whenua Māori Act; and
 - 8.6.2 Draft Statement on Fostering Māori Participation in Council Decision Making.
- 8.7 Staff will write to the nine iwi Trusts, marae, Wakatū Incorporation and Ngāti Rārua Ātiawa Iwi Trust (NRAIT) to invite submissions as part of the consultation process. In addition, information on the LTP consultation will be included in the online iwi engagement tool: Whakawhitiwhiti Whakaaro - Iwi Engagement Space.
- 8.8 During the consultation period the Kaihautū met with representatives from Te Awhina Marae, Manawhenua Ki Mohua, Ngāti Rārua, Ngāti Tama, Ngāti Apa, Ngāti Kuia, Ngāti Koata, Whakarewa (NRAIT) and Wakatū Incorporation. Submissions have been received from seven of these organisations.

9. Significance and Engagement / Hiranga me te Whakawhitiwhiti ā-Hapori Whānui

- 9.1 The overall significance of this decision is low as the report relates to the acceptance of the submissions received. The deliberations on submissions in May 2024 are likely to have a higher level of significance.

10. Communication / Whakawhitiwhiti Kōrero

10.1 All speakers have been contacted with their scheduled time to speak to their submission.

10.2 As of 1 May 2024, staff have not yet confirmed attendance at a hearing by all 150 submitters who have indicated that they wish to speak in support of their submission.

11. Financial or Budgetary Implications / Ngā Ritenga ā-Pūtea

11.1 The decision to accept submissions has no financial implication. The deliberations on submissions in May 2024 will consider the financial implications as part of deliberating on the content in the submissions.

12. Risks / Ngā Tūraru

12.1 Due to the large number of submitters wishing to be heard, staff have allocated each submitter five minutes to speak to their submission, generally with six submitters per hour. This five minute allocation is less than the 10 minutes allocated in previous Long Term Plan hearings but is equivalent to other recent hearings. We have found this time to be sufficient for submitters to provide their views and for questions from the Hearing Panel.

12.2 We recommend that late submissions be accepted up to two days after the close-off date for consultation. Those received after that time should not be accepted. There is a risk that those submitters who returned their submissions after 30 April 2024 will be disappointed with this decision.

13. Climate Change Considerations / Whakaaro Whakaaweawe Āhuarangi

13.1 Hearings are being held at three locations across the District and via Zoom, to minimise the distances submitters need to travel.

14. Alignment with Policy and Strategic Plans / Te Hangai ki ngā aupapa Here me ngā Mahere Rautaki Tūraru

14.1 The submissions will inform decision-making on Tasman’s Ten Year Plan 2024-2034 and concurrent consultations.

15. Conclusion / Kupu Whakatepe

15.1 This report recommends that the Hearing Panel accept the submissions received during the consultation period of 28 March to 28 April 2024. It also recommends that the Hearing Panel accept the late submissions received up until 30 April 2024, and declines to accept those received after that date.

15.2 The report also lists the proposed order of submitters over the three days of hearings for those wishing to speak in support of their submission. Staff will provide a deliberations report to the Hearing Panel prior to the deliberations, which are to be held on 23, 24, 29 and 30 May 2024.
