### 7 REPORTS

# 7.1 Group Manager - Environmental Assurance Report – Kim Drummond

Group Manager – Environmental Assurance, Kim Drummond presented the report and highlighted:

- central government activity and the current reforms that were being embarked on or progressed.
- fast tracked projects it would be the Government clarifying the project schedule and projects, some of which would apply to the Tasman District.
- the Enquiry into Climate Adaptation had now been reported on by the Finance and Expenditure Committee in early October.
- the pattern of reinforcement messages from the Government relating to changes to the Local Government Act and the Resource Management Act, also important changes to the Biosecurity Act and the Building Act which were progressing to council.
- recent regulatory changes and updates and the new equipment at the Harbourmaster's office following additional council investment for the current financial year.

Questions and discussion included projects relating to Tasman (Sams Creek Mine) and the fast tracked consenting act that was currently being progressed by the Government, maintaining council service levels (transition to in-house from contracted service providers), parking enforcement changes, fees and communications.

Mayor King joined the meeting at 10.00am.

### 7.2 Environmental Information Manager's report

Group Manager - Environmental Science, Rob Smith, presented the report and invited Team Leader – Rivers & Coastal, David Arseneau, to present an update item regarding reducing the gravel extraction fees in the Upper Motueka River.

Mr Smith noted an increase in public engagement and removal activity following the recent Taiwan Cherry media coverage.

He discussed the Biosecurity Act Review, and answered questions relating to river system measurement methods and scheduled fees and charges.

A PowerPoint presentation was provided by Team Leader - Natural Hazards & Geomorphology, Alastair Clement.

Flood model results were discussed and Cyclone Gabrielle was outlined as a key example of the rationale for this work.

- a spike in subdivision numbers yet to translate into building activity,
- the central government reforms and how the economy was tracking; and
- customer satisfaction and the timing of surveys relating to consent applications.
